Kerry Laird has been a cook for these conferences for almost as long and is the "Lodge Mom" we all need - especially this week as folks didn't feel well. It was wonderful to have someone the youth felt such a connection to along to cook and reflect on the messages of the week. God certainly was with us in the messy mishaps of the week. We came out more committed to the ways the church upholds us and has brought us together - Christ at the center of these long relationships is a strong glue. Thank you to college student and youth advisor, Jacqueline Cruz; rising junior, Grayson Polhemus and graduated seniors, Camille Peterman, Ethan Tozer and LeKayla Griffin.


