This Listening Circle event will provide a space for people to connect, share their experiences, and look to the future.

During this large and small circle experience, you will be asked questions to explore this issue on a deeper level. When participating in a Listening Circle, we will all have the responsibility to listen and an opportunity to be heard.

To help you prepare for this experience and decide if you would like to attend, we want to ask you to reflect on the following questions:

- Am I prepared to listen deeply to those I may not agree with?
- · Am I prepared to share my experience and perspective, even if others disagree with me?
- · Am I prepared to sit in discomfort?
- · Do I have an apprehension about attending and, if so, can I share it with someone?
- · Will I be able to address the apprehension and still participate?
- · Do I have support if I am unable to continue with the process?



Join the Tallahassee Guns to Gardens Movement



Piety and Private Property in Luke-Acts

The United States is the most economically stratified nation in the Global North today. More than ten years after the Occupy Wall Street movement popularized the language of the one percent and ninety-nine percent, American society is more unequal than ever, with levels of income inequality surpassing the Gilded Age earlier this year. Trends since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic have only exacerbated what has been well underway for decades: the decline of an American middle class, the dispossession of the poor, and the astronomic rise of the ultra-rich.

On Sunday, October 16, Rev. Casey Aldridge joins us again as we explore what Luke and Acts have to say about private property ownership, wealth inequality, and money. What did Jesus tell us to do with our wealth, and why? After his death, how did Jesus' earliest followers organize themselves in response to Jesus' teachings? What was their practical response to the economic and ethical teachings of Jesus? After diving into what the author of Luke and Acts has to say about the perils inherent in private property and inequality, we will turn to think together about what prevents us from living like those apostles today... and if there are other practical responses we can imagine to unprecedented inequality in our time.


SERVING MEALS AT GRACE MISSION

Holy scripture teaches us that God created humankind in god's own image. Christ calls us to love God, with all our mind, soul, and heart, and our neighbor as ourselves. With this comes the sacred responsibility to treat each human being with the love and respect due to a child of God.

We will seek out opportunities to oppose all forms of systematic racism and to ensure that black lives matter, as do those of indigenous, Asian, and Latinx people and persons of all colors or countries of origin.

Our faith tells us that we can do no less, if we truly affirm that all human beings are made in god's image.

We dream of a day in which all persons are treated as bearers of that image.
