# Pastor's Message Rev. Anne H.K. Apple

The 16th Century mystic, John of the Cross said, "Silence is God's first language." And, I carry gratitude for knowing this as a truth after a week at Sacred Heart Monastery in Cullman, Alabama. Reflecting on healing, a common thread that runs throughout Jesus' healings is an outcome of transformation. Jesus heals. People change. Taking the time to sit in silence and listen for God is a helpful practice. The world is a noisy place. Out of silence and reflection, scripture teaches that healed people dance with joy and announce their faith. A conversion happens and people find themselves in a new space - no longer bound, and set free.

Romans 8:1-2, reads: "Therefore there is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death."

This freedom from those things of sin and death that turn us away from God frees us for abundant life. One way I see the abundance of life in Christ at First Presbyterian is through the work of the Session.

On Sunday, the Session met for an abbreviated meeting and then went into an afternoon retreat to be trained in the skill of Compassionate Witnessing led by the Envisioning Reconciliation Committee. I believe that the Holy Spirit was present and is leading towards abundance in life.

Two small groups of elders led an opening worship and a closing worship to the retreat portion. Sue Safford led a period of silence, and an intentional breath practice, to lead the group into the hard work of Compassionate Witnessing.

Thank you for praying for the Session as they retreated into this training. The practice of Compassionate Witnessing is based in scientific research which includes brain chemistry. If you'd like to read about the process, this article describes several instances of Compassionate Witnessing: <u>Compassionate</u> <u>Witnessing</u>. Following an evaluation of this process with the Session, this process will begin to roll out into the congregation. Please speak to an active elder if you would like to know more information about the process.

The Session:

The State of Florida plans to execute Darryl Barwick on Wednesday, May 3, at 6 pm. We have one week to do everything we can to stop this execution. Urge Governor DeSantis and the Florida Board of Executive Clemency to stay the execution – sign and share the petition. Help us reach 10,000 signatures for Darryl.

The non-unanimity bill, SB 450, is now headed to Governor DeSantis to be signed into law. There is still time to stop the most extreme death penalty bill in the country from becoming law. Take action now. Contact Governor DeSantis and urge him to VETO SB 450.

We encourage everyone, not just Florida residents, to take this action for Darryl and for SB 450. The Governor is paying attention to what the nation thinks about his ability to lead. Help us show him the death penalty is bad policy and only creates more harm.

Holy scripture teaches us that God created humankind in god's own image. Christ calls us to love God, with all our mind, soul, and heart, and our neighbor as ourselves. With this comes the sacred responsibility to treat each human being with the love and respect due to a child of God.

We acknowledge the long history of systemic racism that, through violence, laws, policies, and their implementation, was intended to exclude persons who are not Caucasian from benefits and opportunities from the first European settlers who considered themselves entitled to land and violently displaced indigenous people from their homes, to the equally long history of slavery which built the wealth of this country, to Jim Crow laws to current instances of police brutality and the overwhelming mass incarceration of people of color.

We declare ourselves utterly opposed to all forms of systemic racism. We are committed to standing with those who find themselves on the receiving end of any form of racism. We will seek out opportunities to oppose all forms of systematic racism and to ensure that black lives matter, as do those of indigenous, Asian, and Latinx people and persons of all colors or countries of origin.

Our faith tells us that we can do no less, if we truly affirm that all human beings are made in god's image.

We dream of a day in which all persons are treated as bearers of that image.
