Presbytery of Florida Update on the Fall Stated Meeting

Tuesday, October 24, the Presbytery of Florida had its Fall Presbytery Meeting at First Presbyterian Church in Lynn Haven, Florida. When you pulled into the parking lot of the church, you were met by church members AND a bag piper! It was a generous welcome to the nearly 70 elder commissioners, minister members, commissioned ruling elders, Christian educators, presbytery officers and staff, and visitors in attendance. On behalf of First Presbyterian, Elder Glenn Hodges attended, as did his partner, Mary, and Pastor Apple. Last week we shared in this newsletter the Strategic Plan report that was to be presented. Our member, Mary Hodges, served on the Stragetic PlanningTask Force that brought the report forward.

UKirk Tallahassee Campus Minister, Matt Frease, reminded participants to lend their support through UKirk's Friends Fund via a one-time gift or recurring donation; by providing Thursday night meals for students; and by utilizing UKirk's facilities for group gatherings. Elder Peggy Wright Cleveland serves on the UKirk Board of Directors and gathered a group of folks together last year to provide a meal. Reach out to Peggy if you might like to provide for a meal to UKirk!

Participants of the meeting were broken into three groups to discuss the Strategic Plan Report presented by the Task Force. There was significant interest in Recommendation 5, which was about breaking Dogwood Acres off as an independent 501(C)3 non-profit organization. When the report came to the floor for discussion and a vote, the Task Force provided a replacement recommendation stating, in essence, that there be a period of discernment regarding the establishment of Dogwood Acres as a 501(C)3 organization, and that the CPC (Coordinating and Planning Commission) will have oversight to appoint a group that will bring its recommendations to Presbytery at the Fall 2024 stated meeting.
