Reading Chronicles at the front end of the week, I came upon this phrase, "Yield to the Lord." That same night, at a Property Team meeting, Don Winstead referenced the same reading, but drew attention to the phrase regarding King Hezekiah's actions, "he opened the doors to the Temple and repaired them." This is how the Holy Spirit reveals itself to me through scripture — synchronicities throughout the day, and especially in the work of community.

Hezekiah set out to destroy all idol worship in Judah, as the Lord had decreed. Hezekiah reminded the people to rid from their hearts all false worship practices which led to a cleansing of the Temple. To yield to the Lord is to discern, or to find with God, a right way. It is said that Hezekiah prayed, "The good Lord pardon all who set their hearts to seek God." And "the Lord heard Hezekiah, and healed the people."

Last Sunday, morning to afternoon, I witnessed something of God's healing at First Presbyterian — a yielding to the Lord. On World Communion Sunday, the children came to the Lord's Table to sing parts of the liturgy around the Table. God welcomes all — as part of the invitation to the Table; and the Amen at the end of the Great Prayer of Thanksgiving. They have been learning these songs in Sunday School with the Teaching Team. Put those two songs together and we get, "God welcomes all. So be it." Later in the afternoon, at the World Communion Music concert, the joy was palpable in the faces listening to the voices as members of first, and our choir scholars, shared their gifts. Here's how I get to healing — God works out healing by extending a welcome to all that leads to joy by acting with our gifts and listening well with one another.
