Advent Lunch and Learn Series: Encounter — Experience — Action

Join the collaboration of three downtown churches as we host lunch and learn sessions on the intersection between faith and the unhoused. First Baptist Church, First Presbyterian, and Trinity United Methodist Church are seeking to understand issues relating to our unhoused neighbors and envisioning a faithful response. Each session will begin at **noon** with a brief worship service, followed by a presentation and a light lunch:

Wednesday, December 13: Experiences of Those Who are Unhoused. Host: First Presbyterian Church, Westminster Room. Please let Debbie Gibson know if you can help with lunch.

Wednesday, December 20: Taking Action for Those Who Are Unhoused. Host: Trinity United Methodist Church, Moor Hall. Participants will help fill backpacks with food and necessities and then go into the community to distribute them.

New Service Opportunity: First Pres is participating with First Baptist and Trinity Methodist to provide daily **snack packs** to those who are unhoused in our neighborhood. We will provide these every Wednesday at our church at noon beginning in January.

This Sunday, December 10, we will be filling snack packs in the courtyard before the service begins. Come early, or come outside after Sunday School, and help fill some packs! We will also be in the courtyard after worship. Please consider volunteering to help distribute the packs in 2024.

Pastor's Note

At the Wednesday Lunch and Learn Series at First Baptist this week, a woman walked into the room with her young daughter. She spoke to Pastor Terry and said, "I am a victim of sexual abuse and violence and I need help for myself and my children." Pastor Terry worked with Pastor Rachel of Grace Mission and began making connections for health for this family in need. This situation is common. What are we to do as the church?

An invitation to study Christ's incarnation through an embodied lens is one important thing. Two questions I like to ask before coming to study and prayer are *what do I know* and *what do I hope?* What do I know about the incarnation of Christ? What do I hope about Jesus being fully human?

What I know is that the church hasn't always been quick to talk about human bodies. The church has been avoidant about talking about desire and pleasure as God's gifts and instead, in some instances kept secrets, created shame and outright failed people who have suffered harm in their very bodies. I hope that the church could be a place where we could have courageous conversations about our bodies.

This Sunday, the Inquirer's Class will host by Zoom Kara Haug with a workshop presentation, "God and the not so Silent Night." She will dig deep into Christ's incarnation through a woman's body. She is currently writing a chapter for a book that examines how the church has kept secrets and created shame and invites different possibilities for healthy conversations and actions by people of faith. I trust Kara and have seen her leadership lead God's good people towards healthy conversations and growth that connect a life of faith in Jesus Christ and our bodies.

I first met Kara when administering the God's Gift of Sexuality curriculum for parents and their fifth and sixth graders. We realized, as the church, that we needed help to normalize and to equip parents to talk with their children about sexuality, about the good gift of our bodies. Kara was key in making that happen. Kara is the co-founder of <u>Reframing Our Stories</u>, an organization that provides sexual health education, resources, and tools for families and communities to normalize conversations around sex and relationships, remove shame, and reframe our stories to promote openness, acceptance, and a positive sense of self. Looking forward to Sunday with Kara and you all.
