Pastor's Note and Session Report

The pastor's note comes forward with deep gratitude for the work of the church and a look into how we are moving forward towards new pastoral leadership following the interim season. An important action taken at the most recent Session meeting was that the Session approved an operating budget of \$481,670 for 2024.

Colossians 3:16 says, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God." One of the tag lines from the mission statement brought forth at the Session retreat was, "We sing compassion." I hear the songs of compassion, and I am grateful. Marcel Proust, the French novelist, penned, "Let us be grateful to people who make us happy; they are the charming gardeners who make our souls blossom." I am grateful to those 'charming gardeners' at First Presbyterian, Tallahassee.

At the Session meeting the Rev. Lisa Martin, pastor at Lynn Haven Presbyterian Church, who serves on the Pastoral Transition Team (PTT) of Florida Presbytery, and elder Linda Shelley, who serves as our liaison to Florida Presbytery's Committee on Ministry (COM), were present and were introduced. Rev. Martin, Ms. Shelley, and the moderator gave a presentation overviewing the current process of forming a pastoral nomination committee, finding candidates, and extending a call to a called and installed pastor.

It is the Session's intention to seek a called and installed pastor to serve following the departure of interim pastor Anne Apple on June 2, 2024.

The Session had previously requested that outgoing members of the class of 2023 consider serving as the church nominating committee with the responsibility of creating three slates of nominees: (a) additional elders to complete Session roles; (b) members of the trustees and Endowment Management Committee; and (c) members of a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC). The following members agreed to serve: Emily Bruno, Carol Grondzik, Teresa Heiker, and Carol Weissert. A formal action by the congregation is required to elect them. A motion was approved without objection that a congregational meeting be called for Sunday, Feb 4, 2024 for the purpose of electing a church nominating committee.

Rev. Martin explained changes in the applicant process to be used by a PNC. The Church Leadership Connection involves the use of Ministry Description Positions (MDP) and Pastoral Description Positions (PDP) to match applicants with church PNCs.

Mrs. Shelley explained the separate roles of both the Session and the PNC. The Session's role is limited to determining minimum and maximum (within presbytery guidelines) pastoral salary and to hearing periodic reports from the PNC on progress.

In addition to approving the budget, the Session took several other actions and heard additional reports. The Clerk provided an update on the ongoing adoption of "Breeze," a new church management system called Breeze. A motion to make a request to the EMC for \$8,650 from the outreach fund of the endowment to support donations requested by the Compassion and Social Justice Ministry Team to local non-profit entities was approved without objection. A potential overture to the General Assembly regarding divesting from fossil fuels was included in the Session packet and will be considered at the February Session meeting.
