Pastor's Note

This week's Lenten Bible study drew from John 15:1-17. It includes the "I am" statement, "I am the vine, and you are the branches"; and the passage offers a simple invitation, "Abide in me, as I abide in you." That Greek verb for abide is "meno" and has a sense of "remaining and being held continually." We are held in Christ, as Christ holds onto us. We remain in Christ, as Christ remains in us. This is one way that we build faithful relationships — abiding.

In Advent, we began working with First Baptist, Trinity, and Grace Mission. We saw an increase in need for assistance with our unhoused neighbors in downtown Tallahassee. In Lent, one thing that has emerged from that initial Advent work by our Compassion and Social Justice Ministry Team is framed as a possibility. Together, this week the downtown churches submitted an application for a Vista (Volunteers in Service to America) volunteer to be housed at Trinity Methodist. This volunteer would help us to continue our work for the unhoused. This is an opportunity to grow capacity for service with those who have been made poor. Abiding in and with one another, that Christ's love and justice might be known. The church, and churches, doing the ministry of abiding presence.



This church prays for a former colleague, Caitlin Bomar, and her family as she has been diagnosed with terminal breast cancer. I am grateful for these weekly prayers. Caitlin is working on writing a book by the title of "Held." On this journey on which she travels, she says "If I can inhabit freedom, it will radiate from me." The freedom she names is undefined, it is grounded in deep faithfulness in Christ, in abiding in Christ. Christ who says, "Abide in me, as I abide in you." Her courage and witness is beyond remarkable and challenges me to see the places that need repair, and to speak about the freedom I know in Christ.

Christ's Table at First is growing with items you have seen that indicate a need for repair in our little corner of the world in Tallahassee. Thank you for engaging in this embodied practice of worship during Lent. Remember this Sunday is Daylight Savings Sunday! See you then as we come and trust that God refills us through our shared worship together.
