Pastor's Note

This week's pastoral note comes from the Envisioning Reconciliation Committee (ERC). We acknowledge the ERC report endorsed by the Session and presented at the State of the Church meeting during the Inquirer's Class on February 25 may be as hard to read and receive in places as the year-long journey. With intention, the process focused on a difficult time in the congregation's life. Hearing and holding the diversity of the stories was hard work, as was reading and receiving the report and its key findings and recommendations.

The most robust finding that emerged for us, and all of us together, was the strong sense of belonging at First Presbyterian Church. The depth of connection was described repeatedly as the best of what it means to be part of the First Presbyterian Church family. And that belonging, in part, is why the conflict crisis was so painful. We believe this work has been helpful and will assist this congregation in moving forward, knowing that healing takes time. The recommendations reflect where we think there are opportunities to strengthen and grow in faith together.

The intent to create space for the work of the Spirit and God's restoration has always been the priority of the ERC's work. The report is not a judgment; it is a description of our key findings and recommendations after a yearlong prayerful process with multiple components. We served together as a group. One of our findings recognized the lack of structure for healthy communication.
