Pastor's Note

Ephesians 5:7-8

For once you were darkness, but now in the Lord, you are light. Live as children of light for the fruit of Light is found in all that is good and right and true.

In the early days of Advent 2022, we began a season of life together in Christ's church. After the Confession, but before we passed the peace, we sang, "I want to live as a child of the Light." Responding to the Affirmation, there's nothing more true that could be said of my innermost desire than that, "I want to live as a child of the Light."

When Epiphany rose after our first Advent together, we gathered and made stars. A few of those hung in the sanctuary windows. And at the end of the season we handed out stars, each with a word to inspire. God is the Creator of the stars in the night sky and we are co-creators with Christ's love and the Holy Spirit. We have stars as reminders to be light, but also to nudge us to follow, to seek, to search for Christ's light. The light of that first star was a guide that led the wise ones to Christ and sent them home by another way. I wonder how Christ's light will lead us by another way, along a path that we had not expected.

With two weeks left at First Presbyterian, Tallahassee, this part of my star-lit journey is coming to an end. And we are at a necessary ending. Cloud and Townsend describe such an ending in a framework of growth. "Growth itself demands that we move on. Without the ability to end things, people stay stuck, never becoming who they are meant to be, never accomplishing all that their talents could afford them." Jim and I knew our capacity to serve would be stretched in this call — for many reasons — two careers, balancing young adult children in three different cities and aging parents with health challenges in different cities. And we knew this as call. We listened. Risked. Followed. We have been grown here, and trust God will grow us in new ways now as we make our "way home by another way."

One of the hard things about endings is that I know many things will be left undone. Rather than think of these "open items" as missed deadlines, I am going to consider them as talismans to hope, to consider them as representative of the potential of this church and her people. We want to be the healthiest body we can be so that God's mission may be strengthened for service.

God, in Christ Jesus, through the power of the Holy Spirit. God, in three persons,

One God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, Mother of us all, has this church — as God has, does, and will forevermore.

The fruit of Light is found in all that is good, and right, and true.

Each of you is a star and held collectively in God's providence, a beautiful constellation.
