She reminded us that as Jesus came out of the wilderness, where he was famished, and even tempted, that the angels served him. The Greek word for "served" is diakaneo. From that first introduction to angel cards, they became a regular tool for ministry for me. The words on the cards can be of service for reflection, connection, and even prayer. The images can stir creativity and imagination.



The week before I came to Tallahassee, the women's bible study I led in Memphis bought me a "new" set of angel cards for this new context. They asked me to pick eight cards. And then they prayed through them, for you, for us, for our family, for ministry. Those eight cards are pictured here. I laughed last night when I realized the patience card was worn the most. Thank you for letting me test your collective patience.





Beyond scripture, these are the words that have shaped my ministry, and I hand them back to you. Trusting God might shape you through them as you move forward in faith.

Life is short. And we don't have long to tarry with those whom God puts before us. So be swift to love, make haste to be kind, and know you are God's beloved as you move forward in faith.
