Service of Ordination


Glenn Hodges will be ordained on Sunday, July 28,2024 at $4\,\mathrm{PM}$ in the sanctuary.

Pastoral Note

The 226 General Assembly (GA) of the Presbyterian Church U.S.A. (PCUSA) was held in Salt Lake City, Utah, at the Salt Palace Convention Center, between Jun 29 and July 4, 2024. The GA is a church council comprising commissioners from the PCUSA, with teaching elders (ministers of the Word and Sacrament) and ruling elders represented in equal numbers. More than 500 delegates and eighty-two young adult advisory delegates were in attendance. The role of the young adult advisory delegates was to inform commissioners about issues and ideas they might have yet to learn. Commissioners and advisory delegates gathered for in-person plenary sessions to discern the church's direction and make decisions that will be implemented throughout the life of the PCUSA. The GA committees met online in three-day sessions before in-person meetings in Salt Lake City. The GA's theme was "Living into Hope," the name of a 1976 hymn text by Jane Parker Huber.

Approximately 34 overtures were presented to GA by presbyteries. One highlight of the meetings was the approval of both portions of the Olympia Overture. POL01, which had been divided into two parts, will amend the Book of Order to include sexual orientation and gender identity among the categories against which this Church does not discriminate. The purpose of the language is to avoid discriminating against groups of people based on race, gender, socioeconomic status, and ability. This action by the GA reminds us that we should act lovingly toward others and will be sent to presbyteries for ratification. As the presbyteries go about this process, we must remember the importance of living in unity and hope, bearing one another in love.

Another significant moment was the GA's reconsideration and rejection of EVN02, the complete divestment from the fossil fuel industry, after having voted in favor of it earlier in the day. Burning fossil fuels creates air pollution and toxic emissions that drive climate change. It also releases large amounts of carbon dioxide, a greenhouse gas that traps heat in the air and causes global warming.

I was impressed by the witness of the young adult advisory delegates in support of POL01 and EVN02. As each person shared their thoughts, it was encouraging to see and hear the Holy Spirit at work in their expression of love for humanity and the earth. I was witnessing what "living into hope" means. We should all live by their example.
