Pastoral Note

First Presbyterian Church was represented as a member of the Capital Area Justice Ministry (CAJM) at the July 16-19, 2024, DART (Direct Action and Research Training Center) Justice Ministry Conference.

CAJM had nine attendees, representing seven congregations of its 19-member justice ministry, who joined over 300 individuals from 29 other DART Network-affiliated justice ministries. The presenters provided a plethora of thought-provoking information about how we can effectively do justice ministry. Our participation in the event was timely, as CAJM, in partnership with its 19-member congregations, prepares to kick off another season of advocating for social justice.

August is a busy month in our church! Not only are we getting ready for teachers and students to return to the school classrooms, but we are also getting ready to return to our church classrooms. On top of that, we are getting ready to begin planning our social justice work year with CAJM. It's time to renew our interest and commitment to solving the issues of insufficient affordable housing and gun violence.

Thankfully, a core of the Compassion and Social Justice (CSJ) ministry team as well as other members of the congregation became involved and participated in CAJM activities soon after the session approved our church's investment last fall. We attended the CAJM Kickoff where the meeting focused on the goal of at least 1,000 people being present at the Nehemiah Action on April 16, 2024, so that elected officials would pay attention! We invited lead organizer Leah Wiley to join us for worship and fellowship to introduce CAJM to First Presbyterian Church form. We hosted three "house" meetings, allowing interested congregants to discuss and reflect on their values and experiences with community problems, and to be part of the church's justice ministry. We joined other CAJM members at the commissioners' meetings, wearing green for justice to support affordable housing as a Blueprint infrastructure project, to allow spending of public penny tax revenue on producing more affordable housing for low-income families who have to choose between paying rent or childcare, or buying food or medication. We attended the CAJM Pep Rally to launch the April 16 Nehemiah Action, which more than 700 people attended. Finally, we attended the Justice Celebration on June 18 at Temple Israel, which included an update on the issues, investing in the future of CAJM, upcoming training, fall house meetings, and important dates.

So, we have come full circle and even more participation from the congregation is needed. Please be ready to answer with a resounding, "Yes" when CSJ reaches out to you within the next couple of weeks about your participation in CAJM.
