Compassion and Social Justice




The current team focus has been on preparing for Sunday School classes for adults and children, as well as forming a youth group program. Sunday School classes for our youth are in progress, meeting from 9:30 to 10:30 AM. Grades K–5 meet in classroom 306 and begin the day with a music lesson from Ms. Aide. Middle and high Schoolers meet in classroom 301.

The Inquirers Class will begin September 15 at 9:30 AM in the Westminster Room with a social gathering. We will discuss class member memories and impressions of the Inquirers through the years. Members of the steering committee will present the topics for the first several weeks and discuss ideas about what will follow. Class members will be encouraged to share their ideas about interesting topics for future classes.

The Adult Bible Study Class will also begin September 15 at 9:30 AM in the Calvin Room. This class will use the "Feasting on the Word" curriculum, which follows the lectionary. The curriculum includes a study guide and other materials about the week's Gospel reading. Plans for sharing the class leadership will be discussed during this first session.


Pastoral Note

This week will mark the fourteenth Sunday after Pentecost/ Proper 16 or Ordination time. Trinity Sunday was May 26, 2024. The twenty-sixth Sunday of Pentecost will be on November 17, 2024. There are approximately 100 days and twelve Sundays remaining in the Pentecost Season. It begins with celebrating the Day of Pentecost, originally observed as a harvest festival, the Feast of Weeks or *Shavout*. The Festival of Weeks later came to be called Pentecost, which is derived from the Greek for the fiftieth day or fifty-day span of the Easter season. The Day of Pentecost commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit on the Apostles and other followers of Jesus Christ while they were in Jerusalem celebrating the Feast of Weeks.

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. Awe came upon everyone, because many wonders and signs were being done by apostles. All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread at home and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved. - Acts 2:42–47

The Holy Spirit is still at work, calling, gathering, and empowering us in Jesus Christ to grow in discipleship. It calls us to serve others and live responsibly in our relationships. It calls us to be obedient to God. The old self is left behind. Discipleship is an adherence to Christ. It means a life of service, working to make Jesus Christ known and promoting peace, justice, and healing throughout the world.

John Calvin points out that the first and most essential step toward discipleship is a commitment of the heart: "It is a doctrine not of the tongue but of life. It is not apprehended by the understanding and memory alone, as other disciplines are, but it is received only when it possesses the whole soul and finds a seat and resting place in the inmost affection of the heart." (John Calvin, Institutes, vol. 1;3.6.4) During this Pentecost season, how is our heart moving us to respond to the call of discipleship?
