It proposes to the Session the occasions, days, times, and places for worship and for the celebration of the Sacraments. Team members organize ushers, greeters, readers, flowers, musicians, communion, and other worship leaders. The team is responsible for remote broadcasting and the YouTube channel. It works with other teams to prepare and welcome children in worship and to extend communion to those who cannot attend services. It proposes policies for weddings, civic gatherings, and other worship purposes. At times the team has ensured pulpit supply, as well.

Martha Middlebrooks Kutter has been the Chair of the Worship and Music Team for four years. She is currently serving on Session and the Pastor Nominating Committee. She has been a member of First Presbyterian Church for 14 years.




Pastoral Note

September is Disaster Preparedness Month. According to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), this month represents an annual effort to remind us how important it is to prepare for natural disasters and emergencies. Kathryn M. Haueisen and Carol H. Flores, in the book A Ready Hope: Effective Disaster Ministry for Congregations, define disaster as an event that disrupts everyday life, causing physical or mental trauma and damage to personal property or community infrastructures.

The 2024 hurricane season runs from June 1 to November 30, with 85 more days left. According to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, most hurricanes of Category 3 intensity occur in September and October. Two hundred thirty-four Category 3 hurricanes have occurred since the mid-19th century. Hurricane Michael was a category five hurricane that impacted the Florida Panhandle on October 10, 2018. The destruction was widespread, with extensive structural damage to homes and buildings along the Gulf Coast. Since Hurricane Michael in 2018, ten hurricanes and tropical storms have been recorded. This count does not include the tropical storm Ernesto, Hurricanes Debby and Beryl, and tornados that devastated our community this year.

Most religious denominations have national disaster response organizations like Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) for the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). The PDA helps churches, presbyteries, and synods focus on the effects of crises and disasters that impact local communities. They recommend that congregations develop disaster plans to assist them in preparing for a disaster. Specifically, a disaster plan would help a congregation organize and mobilize volunteers, identify disaster-response team members, secure records and assets, seek shelter, and provide spiritual care. Are we ready for a natural disaster or emergency? The PDA has numerous <u>resources</u> to help the Session answer that question.
