Pastoral Note

Stewardship involves nearly every aspect of the church's life and work and is particularly evident in the church's leadership. The roles of elders and trustees are essential to this outward expression of stewardship. In the coming weeks, this congregation will elect a new class of ruling elders and trustees for the class of 2027 to serve a three-year term.


Presbyterian theology defines the elder (Gr. Presbyteros: "presbyter") as an ordained office in the church. Elders are ordained to preach, teach, administer the sacraments, and oversee the church's government. A distinction is made between "teaching" elders (pastors/teachers) and "ruling" elders (laity). The pastor and elders make up the session in a congregation, which directs the church's ministries and programs.

The word "elder" is rooted In the Old and New Testaments, where elders served as leaders of God's people. In the Presbyterian Church U.S.A., women and men are elected as elders. "Ruling elders are named not because they 'lord it over' the congregation (Matthew 20:25) but because they are chosen by the congregation to discern and measure its fidelity to the Word of God and to strengthen and nurture its faith and life." (G-2.0301).

A trustee is a person who serves as an accountable party for a church's legal and financial obligations. Trustees act on behalf of the congregation to manage its business and carry out its orders. The duties of a trustee include receiving, holding, encumbering, managing, and transferring property. They function under the oversight and control of the session.

As we enter the season of Advent, let us prepare to welcome the new class of elders and trustees. Their time and effort will yield rich rewards in this church's ministry and life in the coming months. Stewardship, for us, is a personal response to God's love and gratitude and flows outward to enable a worldwide witness in God's name.
