Pastoral Note

The fourth Sunday of Advent is a day to celebrate love. It is marked by lighting the fourth and final candle on the Advent wreath. The Lord brings the light of love to God's people by sending God's only Son to earth for our salvation. We await the child's birth, whose name is Emanuel. While we await the day of the final reign of God, God is with us in our midst.

God is love, and Christ exemplifies God's divine love for us. The Son of God embraced our nature and demonstrated His teachings through both words and deeds, even unto death, inviting us to Himself through love. Our relationship with Christ signifies an encounter with God's gracious love and forgiveness of sins. God grants the gift of faith through the Holy Spirit so that we, as God's people, can love and serve God and live for God's glory. The entirety of the Christian life is rooted in the Spirit, who dwells within and among the Christian community. (Gal. 5:25) God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit given to us.

The Confession of 1967 states, "God has created the peoples of the earth to be one universal family in God's reconciling love." (BC 9.44) As we light the fourth candle of Advent, we celebrate God's love in sending Jesus and remember that love as we look forward to Christ's second coming.
